

## LOCAL NOTICE TO MARINERS No. 10 of 2022

### Water Injection Dredging within Harbour Limits

**MARINERS SHOULD NOTE** that water injection dredging pontoon '10-4' (pushed by harbour workboat 'ERICA') is now engaged in dredging within Harbour Limits for a period of 10 consecutive tides, which commenced today Monday 27<sup>th</sup> June 2022.

Work is due to be carried out at Tarmac's commercial wharves, Littlehampton Marina and Harbour Board moorings at Dukes Wharf, Town Quay and Pier Road. Operations will take place during the night as well as by day. As dredging operations will be continuous throughout the period, mariners should expect to pass 'ERICA+10-4' at any time.

Lights and shapes will be displayed as required by the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea. The rigid push arrangement will be restricted in its ability to manoeuvre during operations. All other craft should give 'ERICA+10-4' (and the areas surrounding) a wide berth and monitor VHF Channel 71 for any instructions. Mariners are requested to reduce speed to minimum for safe steering when passing any vessel engaged in dredging or survey activities.

ERICA will maintain a listening watch on VHF Channel 16 and 71 throughout operations, and mariners may also request movement information from the Harbour Office during working hours.

Demobilisation is scheduled for the morning of Saturday 2nd July 2022, but mariners should also note that these timings are subject to amendment as required by weather conditions and are reminded to keep a good look out until these works are completed.



Cancel this Notice on completion of all works on or after 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2022.
